Who is really on the other side of the screen?

Not everyone on the internet is who they say they are.

Identity theft

It is someone who pretends to be a real person using their name, photos, or accounts.

- ★ They use a real person's identity.
- ★ They don't need a personal relationship.
- ★ They seek to access accounts, money, or data.

Possible impersonation if...

- ★ Messages or posts appear that you didn't write.
- ★ Passwords or logins are changed for no reason.
- ★ Your photos are used on profiles that aren't theirs.

If you suspect impersonation.

- ★ Change your passwords immediately.
- ★ Save evidence (screenshots).
- ★ Report the profile or if the passwords are not yours.

Not everyone on the internet is who they say they are.

catfishing

It's someone who creates a fake profile to start an online relationship.

- ★ A fabricated or stolen profile.
- ★ It's based on an emotional connection.
- ★ It aims to manipulate, blackmail, or extort money.

Possible catfishing if...

- ★ The relationship is progressing too quickly.
- ★ Avoid video calls or in-person meetings.
- ★ Ask for money, favors, or to keep the relationship a secret.

If it's catfishing

- ★ Cut off contact and block them.
- ★ Don't send anything else (money, photos, personal information).
- ★ Save evidence and report it.
